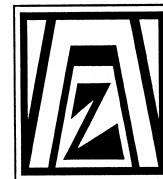

Parking structures are accessed on the north side of the building (up the ramp) if you approach from the north, or on the south side (down the ramp) if you approach from CCN Drive or from the south on Colo Blvd by turning into the Water Works Car Wash, just south of the hotel and at the NW corner of the intersection, driving thorough and following signs to the hotel parking. Handicapped parking is available in the parking structures and also at street level in front of the hotel, accessed from Colo Blvd driving south.

Invocation—Dorothy Swindt presented the invocation after reading an excerpt of "When I am an old woman I shall wear purple" in celebration of her birthday.

Member Moment—Lydia Scherek presented Julie Bradley to the membership as the Zontian of the Year with a description of her life, travels, careers, goals and aspirations.

Program Jackie Norris, Executive Director of Metro Volunteers!, gave an excellent presentation on her organization whose mission is connecting volunteers and promoting volunteerism. She gave an overview of volunteerism today and put into perspective what it is to recruit and retain volunteers—not unlike recruitment and retention of members in Zonta.

Business Meeting

Minutes- September's were approved as presented and October minutes were approved as printed.

Treasurer's report: Nikki Headlee stated we had \$8, 367 in the club operating account and a 2nd quarters' report will be printed in the January Smoke Signal after the end of the quarter in December. We have 41 paid members and we are losing member Marianne Latz whose husband has taken a job in Raleigh, NC. We hope there is a Zonta club in the area there for her to transfer to.
